Qualitative research; coding; theme-identification

- 2. Construct meaningful themes from coded data, synthesizing insights to generate coherent narratives that reflect the depth and complexity of interview responses.
- **3.** Critically analyze and interpret qualitative interview findings, drawing connections between themes and broader research questions, and effectively communicating results in written format.
